RECYCLING

The commercial sector generates nearly 3/4 of the solid waste in California. Much of the commercial sector waste disposed in landfills is readily recyclable.

Assembly Bill 341 requires all businesses and multi-family units that generate 4 cubic yard or more of trash per week to arrange for recycling services.

Effective July 1, 2020, MCR- and MORE-covered businesses must provide organics and recycling containers

metal beverage & food cans,
aerosol cans,
clean aluminum pans & foil

Mixed Dry Paper

clean paper, magazines,
newspaper, cardboard,
junk mail, styrofoam

Only clean, dry, recyclable materials in blue containers and / or blue recycling stickers
